ENCOURAGING U.S. TRADE

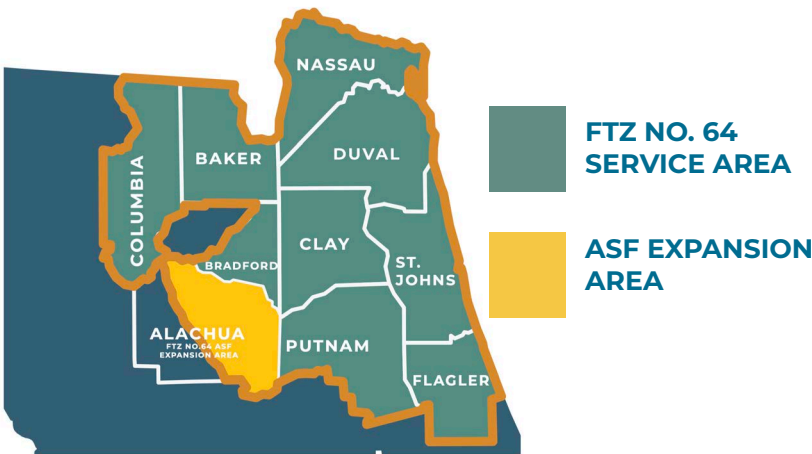
A Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) in the United States is a designated location where companies can use special procedures to increase cash flow and savings. FTZs are subject to the laws of the U.S., but are located outside of Customs territory and are exempt from most local, state and federal taxes.

FOREIGN TRADE ZONE NO. 64

FTZ No. 64 is spread across 5,000 acres in Northeast Florida, and JAXPORT is the administrator of the program. FTZ No. 64 is Florida's busiest zone by designated acreage and number of active sites, handling a variety of cargoes including food products, vehicles, leather goods, beverages, furniture, housewares and crafts, and more.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

Businesses operating in FTZ No. 64 employed more than 1,500 U.S. workers in 2021, according to the U.S. Foreign Trade Zones Board's annual report.
